To Whom It May Concern:

Regis High School will be hosting a dance on **November 20, 2009**. We hope your students can join us! **It is imperative that your students be apprised of the following guidelines so that things run smoothly at Friday's dance.**

- < Regis students are the only males allowed to attend this dance event. To ensure the safety of all students attending the dance, Regis students and ALL female guests **MUST** bring their high school ID to gain admission! **NO ONE, under any circumstances, will be permitted to enter Regis if they do not adhere to this guideline!** This is the biggest issue we have been facing. Girls have been forgetting to bring their high school identification cards, and if they do not have a form of ID, they will be turned away at the door. Another form of picture ID with a letter from a school official identifying the bearer may act as a substitute for schools that have not yet distributed ID cards. Again, we cannot stress enough that it is imperative that every person entering the dance has some form of picture ID.
- < Students should be orderly throughout the evening. Accordingly, no "moshing"/slam dancing is permitted at the dance. Kissing, groping, and "grinding" are not appropriate actions in a public venue. Any student failing to abide by these directives may be ejected from the dance.
- < Any student found intoxicated or consuming alcoholic beverages or other drugs will have his or her parents called. They will be required to pick up their child from the dance.
- < For the safety of all, students should travel to and from the dance in groups. Additionally, they should leave the area of the school as soon as possible after the dance's conclusion.
- < The dance begins at 7:00 p.m. and ends promptly at 10:30 p.m. **Students attending the dance must arrive at Regis before 9:00 p.m. and, once inside, may not leave before 10:00 p.m. unless a parent meets them at the exit on 85th Street.** Students may not leave and reenter the dance.
- < Casual attire is expected, but if one wonders whether the outfit is appropriate to wear to a Catholic school, it probably isn't.
